Full Terms and Conditions of Entry

The final date for entry will be **Sunday 8th August 2021 at 5pm**. No entries after this date will be considered.

- There is no entry fee for this competition.
- Whilst students will retain copyright to the entry they submit, entrants agree to the use of their name, school logo and submitted work in any publication or printed material, and for display on the Planetary website or associated channels for the purposes of peer voting, publicity or marketing.
- Participating schools agree to potential publication of their school logo within the Anthology in either print or digital format.
- Any other personal data relating to the winners, schools, staff, or any other entrants will be used solely in accordance with current UK data protection legislation and will not be disclosed to a third party without the entrant's prior consent. You can view our data policy [here](#).
- Entries must be the original work of entrant students and must not infringe the rights of any other party. Entries may have been created prior to the introduction of the competition so long as they meet the requirements.
- The 'prize' is divided into two parts. Firstly, publication in the collaborative student Anthology and a copy of the Anthology for both the entrant and the submitting school. Secondly, the recently announced prize as referred to below. No cash or other alternative prizes will be offered.
- A portion of any potential proceeds raised through ultimate sale of the Anthology will be fed into philanthropic ventures via Planetary International and in support of future UKSSN projects.
- ***UPDATED*** School staff may submit entries on behalf of their students, or a student may enter directly from a school email address, copying in a relevant teacher for reference. All entries must reflect one of the five listed topics. Students may enter once per category.
- Entries will be shortlisted by year group and category by independent UKSSN judging panels. All entries will be shortlisted by Tuesday 31st August, 2021.
- Winning entries in each category will be chosen by a public voting poll via the 'You' section of the Planetary website. The vote will run from Friday 10th September 2021 to Friday 1st October 2021. A simple, free signup to the site will be required to claim a vote for each category.

- Winners will be notified via the email address by which their work was originally submitted during the first week of October. The winning entries will also be featured on the Planetary website.
- Should a relation of any official competition shortlisting judge/Planetary/UKSSN team member enter the competition, they must only be shortlisted by an unrelated panel and shall not be selected as a winner by any other method than public vote.
- Winning pieces will be included in the anthology, which will be printed using sustainable methods and/or in digital format. Planetary reserves the right to include any pieces from the final shortlists in the resulting anthology and utilise these pieces for publicity or promotional purposes during and after the COP26 summit.
- By entering this competition, the entrant and their submitting school indicate their agreement to be bound by these terms and conditions.
- Planetary, UKSSN and associated bodies reserve the right to review all competition entries for appropriateness and refuse entry, or refuse to move work to the shortlist stage, if an entry is in breach of these terms and conditions, and reserve the right to alter the competition terms and conditions and process as necessary.

The Prize

The 'prize' is divided into two parts:

1. Publication in the collaborative student Anthology and a copy of the Anthology for both the entrant and the submitting school.
 2. The recently announced prize as referred to below.
- An overall winner in each category - poetry, art and photography - will be determined by peer/public vote via the Planetary website as stated above.
 - The overall winners in each category irrespective of age or year group will be entitled to claim the grand prize as well as featuring in the anthology.
 - The prize is offered as follows, with no right to claim an alternative of the same value:
 - A 2-day trip for 3 x winners plus an accompanying parent, to include;
 - A tour of the Goodwood Estate that could take in locations such as the organic, mixed farm - Home Farm, Goodwood Park and the Motor Circuit and Aerodrome. This will be followed by a complimentary dinner and overnight stay (accommodation included) in the Goodwood Hotel.
 - On day two, a 3-hour guided safari of the Knepp Castle Estate, both locations in West Sussex.
 - Winners must be accompanied by an adult parent or guardian for the duration of the trip.

- Following the conclusion of the competition, Planetary will attempt to secure a range of dates for winners and their parents/guardians to select from in 2021 and will coordinate with each winner and their parent/guardian to attend.
- Date restrictions apply and are subject to availability. The Knepp season is Easter-end of October. Goodwood will be unavailable during mid-September and mid-October due to large scale events.
- Due to current Covid-19 restrictions and the dates of the competition process, it may be necessary to offer alternative dates in 2022, subject to availability.
- All other expenses including travel and food beyond the complimentary dinner at the Goodwood Hotel are the responsibility of each winner and their parent or guardian. No credit will be given to cover costs outside of the prize specified.
- Planetary International, Knepp Wildland and Goodwood Estate reserve the right to change or withdraw the prize offered. Winners will be notified of any changes.
- Should a student from an internationally based school be voted the overall winner of any of the three stated categories, Planetary will seek to provide an alternative prize suited to the location of the winner.
